Telephone and Wi-Fi service was out for a long time. A lot of homes were flooded, but those homes on stilts suffered damage below with the loss of appliances and cars. The weekly food distribution at our church missed only one day due to water that got into Fellowship Hall but did no damage to the floors which were cleaned up in a week. Many charitable organizations brought truckloads of food and water for over two weeks. The Lord is good, and we have received the bounty of His blessings every day. God bless you all. Veterans Day is a U.S. legal holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars. Veterans Day 2022 will occur on Friday, November 11. In 1918, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied nations and Germany in World War I, then known as "the Great War." Commemorated in many countries as Armistice Day the following year, November 11th became a federal holiday in the United States in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became known as Veterans Day. In the United States, an official wreath-laying ceremony is held each Veterans Day at the <u>Tomb of the Unknown Soldier</u> in Arlington National Cemetery, while parades and other celebrations are held in states around the country. Veterans Day is not to be confused with Memorial Day, a common misunderstanding, according to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Memorial Day (the fourth Monday in May) honors American service members who died in service to their country or because of injuries incurred during battle, while Veterans Day pays tribute to all American veterans—living or dead—but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime. Hurricane IAN was pretty rough on the church landscaping and shrubs. As you can see from the photos, all of the crotons that were planted along the driveway are gone. They were submerged in the brackish water that surrounded our church. We lost all of them and they had to be removed. We are back to bare rocks and sour soil. We need your help to replace this; however, we are advised not to plant back into the ground. Instead, it is suggested we use planters that have good soil. You can see in the first picture how it will look with planters. The second picture shows two colors for the planters. Those who have been asked, have preferred the red planter. So, the challenge is this: \$20 will buy one bag of soil, or one plant, or one planter. It is a long driveway and will take a goodly amount of money to replace what we had. We have not fully evaluated the damage to our Memorial Garden yet and will let you know what it will take to restore it.
