PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT TO THE CHURCH 2022

This was another year of difficulties due to COVID-19. We didn't have to close church, but we still had social distance seating the first part of this year. And we finally took our masks off! We stopped having Sunday lunch following Morning Worship until November 20th when we began them again. And I'm happy to report, we've held together as a church and as a family of believers. As of this Report, we are back to normal! Fellowship Lunches are popular once again, and we are looking forward to the coming new church year.

Someone asked how our stewardship has been holding up. I am pleased to inform you that our regular Sunday offerings have been strengthened by offerings being mailed directly to the church at: P.O. Box 177, Everglades City, FL 34139; Stripe-On-line Giving through our website http://evergladescommunity.church, individuals participating in Amazon Smile and the Regular Offering plate each Sunday. Your continued regular support of this ministry is vital!

Our ministry by video through our website and direct email is strong. We are reaching a good many who no longer live in our community, are sick or shut-in, or away for the Season. This has proved to be a valuable asset to our outreach ministry.

Our Mission Program has not been affected. We are serving between 120-130 families each week through our Food Distribution Program. At Thanksgiving we distributed 150 frozen turkeys donated by the Miccosukee Indian Community. We have continued supporting our Baja Mission, Copeland Baptist Church, Shelter for Women, Holly's Hope, and Our Troops and Christmas Shoebox Ministry and local emergency needs.

Our church Fellowship Hall is being used by Everglades City Lions Club meetings and Chokoloskee Church of God for a Wednesday Bible Study and community meetings when needed.

I believe it would be accurate to say that the Friendly Little Church on the Circle in Everglades City is alive and well and looking forward to increasing its ministry in 2023.

SUNDAY SCHOOL BEGINS JANUARY 1, 2023 EZEKIEL

Some of you are going to ask, "Pastor, why are we studying Ezekiel?" Well, the prophets Daniel and Ezekiel were both prisoners of war and taken to Babylon. That's where there's a difference - Daniel was a celebrated Jewish scholar and master interpreter of dreams who was exiled to Babylon after the destruction of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. He lived in the King's palace. He successfully interpreted the proverbial "writing on the wall". He miraculously survived the lions' den. Ezekiel, however, lived in a refugee camp along a river. When he was 30 years old, he should have become a priest in Jerusalem. His early prophecies there were pronouncements of violence and destruction. Later, in Babylonian exile, he addressed the hopes of the Israelites return. The faith of Ezekiel in the ultimate establishment of a New Covenant between God and the people of Israel had great influence on the reconstruction and reorganization of Judaism after the Exile. Ezekiel received a word from the Lord causing him to do the most peculiar things. He hoped to get God's people to pay attention and turn back to God in repentance. For that reason, it is hoped that by this study God's people will begin to pay attention to what's going on in the world and begin to repent. You, and your friends, are invited to this study every Sunday morning in Jenkins Hall at 9:45 A.M.
