Insurance Deductible Assistance Program Application Deadline Extended to March 31, 2023

If you are a homeowner whose primary residence is in Collier County, Florida and it sustained damage from Hurricane Ian, Collier County is helping qualified applicants with their insurance deductible. The applicant must meet income limits up to 120% area median income (AMI). Residential value of the primary residence, according to the Collier County Appraiser, cannot exceed \$458,634.60. The maximum award for a household is \$20,000. A second home and/or rental property will not meet the program requirements. Applications are currently open. Applications are to be completed online at:

The portal will close on Friday, March 31, at 5 p.m.

The county received \$334,700 from the State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP) Disaster Assistance program to distribute in the community. Application will be processed in the order they are received. Only complete application and fully qualified applicants will be processed.
