The Season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 14th and continues until Maundy Thursday, March 28th three days before Easter Sunday. Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays. The word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lectern, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan, and preparing to begin His ministry. Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts. And then it became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending themselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themself for others. Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days, because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." That's why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the church bulletin naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection. You will see displayed in the front of the church a large candle sitting in a tall (usually 48 inches) stand. It bears a light high in the vision and hearts of the people as they cry, "Alleluia! Christ is risen." This candle is called the paschal candle, "Pasch" comes from the Hebrew word "pesah," meaning deliverance or Passover -- thus connecting the Resurrection to the Exodus.
