Including a church in your will is a great way to make a lasting impact on a cause that's important to you. Here's a step-by-step guide on how to do it:

- 1. **Consult with an Attorney.** It's always wise to work with an estate planning attorney to ensure your will is legally valid and that your wishes will be carried out as you intend. They can help you navigate the legal language and requirements in your area.
- 2. **Decide on the Gift.** Determine what kind of gift you want to leave to the church. Common types include:

**Monetary donation**: A specific amount of money or a percentage of your estate.

**Property or assets**: This could include real estate, stocks, or personal property.

**Designated funds**: You can specify that the church use the gift for a particular purpose, such as a building fund, mission work, or general ministry.

- 3. **Include Specific Language in Your Will**. In your will, include a section that explicitly mentions the church, the amount or property you wish to leave, and any stipulations about how the gift should be used. Here's an example of how that could be phrased:
- "I give and bequeath [specific dollar amount or description of property] to [Full Name of the Church], located at [address of the church], to be used for [specific purpose, if any]."
- 4. **Ensure the Church Can Accept the Gift**. Some churches may have policies regarding how they accept gifts through wills. It's a good idea to contact the church in advance and discuss your plans. They may need certain legal or tax documentation to properly receive and manage your gift.

It's helpful to discuss this with your attorney or a tax advisor to make sure you're maximizing any available tax benefits.
  - 6. Review and Update Your Will Regularly

If your circumstances change (for example, you acquire new assets or the church's needs change), make sure to update your will accordingly.
